RE: AB 504 (Reyes) State and Local Public Employees: Labor Relations: **Disputes. Notice of Opposition**

Dear Senator Cortese,

The City of Garden Grove writes to express our opposition to AB 504. This measure would declare the acts of sympathy striking and honoring a picket line a human right. AB 504 would also void provisions in public employer policies or collective bargaining agreements limiting or preventing an employee's right to sympathy strike.

State laws governing collective bargaining are in place to ensure a fair process for both unions and public entities. AB 504 upends the current bargaining processes which allows striking only in specified limited circumstances. Specifically, this bill states, notwithstanding any other law, policy, or collective bargaining agreement, it shall not be unlawful or a cause for discipline or other adverse action against a public employee for that public employee to refuse to do any of the following:

- Enter property that is the site of a primary labor dispute.
- Perform work for an employer involved in a primary labor dispute.
- Go through or work behind any primary picket line.

This poses a serious problem for public agencies that are providing public services on a limited budget and in a time of a workforce shortage. Allowing for any public employee, with limited exception, to join a striking bargaining unit in which that employee is not a member could lead to a severe workforce stoppage. When a labor group is preparing to engage in protected union activities, local agencies have the ability to plan for coverage and can take steps to limit the impact on the community. This bill would remove an agency's ability to plan and provide services to the community in the event any bargaining unit decides to strike. A local agency cannot make contingency plans for an unknown number of public employees refusing to work.

The City of Garden Grove is not disputing the right of the employee organization to engage in the protected activity of striking. State law has created a framework for when unions can engage in protected strike activity that has been honored by local government and unions alike. Unfortunately, this bill would allow those who have not gone through the negotiation process to now refuse to work simply because another bargaining unit is engaging in striking.

AB 504 would void locally bargained memorandums of understanding (MOUs) regardless of what they say about the employee's ability to sympathy strike and would insert the ability for employees to engage in sympathy striking. No-strike provisions in local contracts have been agreed to by both parties in good faith often due to the critical nature of the employees' job duty. By overriding local MOUs, AB 504 would grant sympathy strikers greater rights than the employees engaged in a primary strike. Under current law, both primary and sympathy strikes may be precluded by an appropriate no-strike clause in the MOU, which this bill proposes to override only for sympathy strikes. Additionally, under current law, essential employees of a local public agency as defined by the California Public Employment Relations Board (PERB) law and further described in more detail by the collective bargaining agreement, cannot engage in a primary or sympathy strike. This bill would override these safeguards for sympathy strikers.

This bill declares sympathy striking a human right but exempts any public employee who is subject to Section 1962 of the Labor Code from having that right. Given that this bill would void local MOU no-sympathy strike agreements while exempting a specific job type, at the same time as declaring a new human right, it would only create confusion regarding which public employees cannot engage in sympathy striking.

Local agencies provide critical health and safety functions, including disaster response, emergency services, dispatch, mobile crisis response, health care, law enforcement, corrections, elections, and road maintenance. Local MOU provisions around striking and sympathy striking ensure local governments can continue to provide critical services. In many circumstances, counties must meet minimum staff requirements, e.g., in jails and juvenile facilities, to ensure adequate safety requirements. AB 504 overrides the essential employee process at PERB, thereby creating a system where any employee can sympathy strike, which could result in workforce shortages that jeopardize our ability to operate. In addition, it is unclear if this bill would apply to public employees with job duties that require work in a multi-jurisdiction function, like a law enforcement task force, where one entity is on strike. Shutting down government operations for sympathy strikes is an extreme approach that goes well beyond what is allowed for primary strikes and risks the public's health and safety.

For these reasons, the City of Garden Grove respectfully opposes AB 504.

Cottage Industries gets close

The Cottage Industries project, which involves repurposing small older homes east of Garden Grove's Civic Center district, delayed for years by a pandemic and a split-up, is starting to take shape.

Situated from 9th Street to Civic Center Drive and north of Garden Grove Boulevard, Cottage Industries is aiming to bring unique small businesses to the area that aims to add appeal to the city's historic core.

First up could be Smoke Queen Barbecue on Ninth Street where construction is nearing completion and hiring is underway.

Smoke Queen is the creation of chef and restauranteur Winnie Yee-Lakhani, who plans to combine the flavors of her Chinese and Malaysian heritage with the traditional American style of smoking to achieve an "east meets west" fusion. Others in the first wave are Eco Now (locally-sourced, handmade and eco-friendly goods) and GameCraft Brewing (a micro-brewery with board games and live comedy and musical entertainment.

Invisibility of children experiencing homelessness in OC highlighted in new report

It's difficult to count and track the number of homeless people in Orange County, especially children. These children have higher rates of absenteeism and face several challenges in obtaining a well-rounded education.

The 2022 Point In Time Count tallied 721 children under the age of 18 in Orange County who were experiencing homelessness. But a recent OC Grand Jury report notes that number differs greatly from the 23,246 children identified by the county's school districts based on the federal McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development requires all jurisdictions to complete the Point In Time count every two years; in 2022, Orange County sent teams out over three days to canvas communities to count those living in cars and on the streets as well as calculate the number of individuals and families in emergency shelters and transitional housing programs.

HUD categorizes homelessness as either sheltered or unsheltered. Sheltered homelessness refers to people found in emergency shelters, transitional housing or other temporary arrangements.

"That does not count people who are experiencing homelessness who lack a fixed nightly abode, who fit into potentially staying with another family member, in a motel, in a variety of other settings," Doug Becht, director of OC Health Care Coordination, said. That's where McKinney-Vento comes in.

The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act is a federal law created to support the enrollment and education of homeless students. In contrast to HUD, various other living arrangements meet the McKinney-Vento definition of homeless, such as youth who are living in motels, recreational vehicles or sharing housing with multiple families.

While there are efforts from the county and school districts to address homelessness and ensure that no student is left behind, homeless children are failing to receive enough support from either to address their unique needs and challenges in getting an education. The OC Grand Jury report says that because the county and schools use different definitions to identify homeless students, children are being undercounted, leading to a negative impact on their education.

"What has happened is the invisibility continues to be persistent because we fail to operate under the national definition of students experiencing homelessness," Jennifer Friend, CEO at Project Hope Alliance, said. "It is the broader definition. Our greatest challenge has been in lifting the invisibility of how many kids there really are in our county experiencing homelessness."

Schools are not designed to meet every need of students experiencing food or housing insecurity, transportation barriers or mental health crises, Friend said. As a solution, school districts have worked with organizations like Project Hope Alliance to bring resources directly to students.

Project Hope Alliance is an organization that places case managers at school sites for children and youth experiencing homelessness. Case managers identify homeless students and address their basic needs, such as food, clothing or transportation. They also conduct regular check-ins, provide educational support and connect children and families to other resources.

"In the state of California, 21% of all students experiencing homelessness are chronically absent versus only 9.8% of their housed peers being absent. Yet, only 8.3% of all school districts receive any type of money to support students experiencing homelessness," Friend said. "The invisibility perpetuates the lack of resources, which then results in us failing our kids."

The organization works with several Orange County districts, including Newport-Mesa Unified School District. Socorro Shiel, an assistant superintendent with the district, said much of what students need is outside of schools' control, and they rely on strong partnerships with resources such as Project Hope Alliance, which offer ongoing support for homeless students.

"It really is about being a conduit for other community-based organizations, for other city and county services to help families," Shiel said. "The goal for schools is just to have the strongest families possible because the stronger the family, the stronger the student is and the less adult issues a student has to be worrying about."

An Tran, director of the OC Social Services Agency, said the goals of McKinney-Vento are different from the goals and programs operated within the county. The County of Orange doesn't

have a specific department that targets homeless children because they are picked up with the care for families, Tran said.

"The reason why is many times, individuals, especially children, come with families," Tran said. "We have programs that we operate on behalf of the state and federal government that provide services to homeless families as a whole. Many of these children come within family units and the entire family unit needs care and needs supportive services."

The county also works with the Orange County Department of Education and school districts to help with transportation and other resources for children in the foster care system, Tran said. Liaisons are in place to help the county coordinate the care and educational needs of the foster children.

Each school district is responsible for helping fulfill the needs of homeless students, OC Department of Education homeless education coordinator Jeanna Awrey said, noting schools provide the resources they can to best support homeless students, but "if there's not a house, there's nothing we can do."

"That's the biggest challenge because we can help them get to school, we can help them get school supplies, help them to a tutor," Awrey said. "But, if they don't have a permanent house that they're going to on a daily basis, that will make it very difficult for a parent and the child."

The OC Grand Jury concluded that "public schools are failing far too often in their efforts to educate children experiencing homelessness."

The jury recommends the OC Department of Education form a joint task force made up of district-level administrators from each school district and leadership from nonprofit organizations that serve homeless families to address absenteeism, low test scores and low graduation rates of children experiencing homelessness.

It is also recommended that local school districts develop a plan that includes yearly mandatory McKinney-Vento Act training for all district and school administrators, teachers, office staff and counselors.

As for the county, the Grand Jury wants to see it develop a plan to increase the number of family shelters, permanent supportive housing and low-cost/long-term housing for families. The jury said the County Board of Supervisors should find financial funding to support all Orange County school districts with enrolled children experiencing homelessness to meet the mandate to equitably educate these students.

Friend believes the solution is for every government agency at every level and community members to join together to build a system that works for homeless children.

"It's time to build a strategy to meet the needs that students are experiencing outside of the classroom that are preventing them from accessing their education. That's going to require our community to come together at every level," Friend said.

"It's going to take all of us," said Friend.

REQUEST:

A request for a one-year time extension for the approved entitlements under Site Plan No. SP-081-2020 and Tentative Tract Map No. TT-18181 to subdivide an existing 47,284 square foot lot, improved with a single-family home, into four (4) residential lots that will be served by a private street designed as a culde-sac (Lot 5). The approval allowed each parcel with a lot size of 10,031 square feet (Lot 1), 8,312 square feet (Lot 2), 10,520 square feet (Lot 3), and 7,783 square feet (Lot 4). The existing single-family home will be reconfigured to fit within the developable lot area of Lot 1, and Lots 2, 3, and 4, will each be developed with a new two-story, single-family home. Also, a minor land deviation was approved to allow the front yard fence for Lot 1, located along Lampson Avenue to be constructed at a height of 6 feet. A CEQA determination is not required as the project was previously exempted.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Approval of one-year Time Extensions for Site Plan No. SP-081-2020(TE2) and Tentative Tract Map No. TT-18181(TE2).

A request to operate a new restaurant, Sabroso! Mexican Grill, in an existing 2,780 square foot tenant space within a pad building located at 13091 Harbor Boulevard. The requested site plan approval includes exterior tenant improvements and the addition of a 927 square foot patio dining area. Also, a request for Conditional Use Permit approval for a new original State Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) Type "47" (On-Sale, General) License. The site is in the HCSP-DC (Harbor Corridor Specific Plan-District Commercial) zone. In conjunction with the request, the Planning Commission will also consider a determination that the project is categorically exempt from the California Environmental

Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15303 – New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures – of the State CEQA Guidelines.

Cal Cities halts revenue-endangering bills

The League of California Cities notched two new wins for cities this week. Two bills that would have jeopardized local revenues were held for the year due to Cal Cities' advocacy. <u>Safeguarding local revenues</u> is one of Cal Cities' major advocacy priorities for 2023.

Well-intended housing fund bill goes back to the drawing board

Sen. Monique Limón today said she is holding her proposed, 15% statewide <u>short-term</u> <u>rental tax</u>. Proceeds would have gone back to local governments as grants for "laborforce housing."

Cal Cities supported the author's intent to provide long-term funding for affordable housing. However, a statewide tax on top of existing local rates would cripple tourism-dependent cities. Cal Cities had proposed levying a tax or fee on short-term rental owners, instead of the lodger.

SB 584 faced several major hurdles. A broad group of stakeholders, including local government groups, opposed the measure. The bill needed a two-thirds majority in both houses to pass. It squeaked out of the Senate with the minimum number of votes. SB 584 is now on hold for the year, as the bill's author works with Cal Cities and others to determine a possible path forward. Local officials played a key role in halting the bill and will play an equally important role in shaping any future amendments.

Committee chair presses pause on pension divestment measure

Asm. Tina McKinnor on Tuesday said she is holding <u>SB 252 (Gonzalez)</u> in the Assembly Public Employment and Retirement Committee. The bill would have forced the state's public pension systems to divest from oil and gas companies. Cal Cities opposed SB 252 due to its potential financial impact on local governments. Many public agencies rely on the state pension system to provide retirement benefits.

The committee chair said she needed more time to negotiate with labor unions and other organizations, including local governments. Last year, then-chair Asm. Jim Cooper blocked a similar measure, <u>citing the bill's financial impacts</u>. McKinnor's chief of staff echoed that sentiment.

"Ms. McKinnor's primary concern is about the retirees themselves," Terry Schanz told *Politico*. "This is their money. We have a responsibility to make sure the fund is solvent."

Less-than-expected returns have led to a drop in total assets for the state's pension funds. Divestment would only increase the likelihood of further increasing employer contributions and by extension, local budgets.



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
